We are delighted to announce the Second Annual Evidence Summer Workshop (ESW2020) to be held at Vanderbilt Law School in Nashville, TN, on August 6-7, 2020. (In the event of health concerns or travel restrictions, ESW2020 will be held through an online forum.)

The Evidence Summer Workshop provides evidence scholars an annual venue to present their latest projects, share ideas, and develop lasting relationships among each other. The Workshop includes sessions for working drafts, as well as smaller group sessions for works at an earlier stage of development.

All evidence scholars, whether presenting or not, are welcome to register and attend. Those wishing to present should submit an abstract of approximately 250 words (and in no case greater than 500 words) by **May 1, 2020** on the conference webpage, evidenceworkshop.com. We welcome submissions from scholars at all stages of their careers, though some preference will be given to those within their first decade of teaching. Selection decisions will be made by mid- to late-May.

ESW2020 includes all meals (dinner, breakfast, lunch) for registrants. Participants are responsible for their own housing and travel costs. A block of rooms will be reserved at a nearby hotel for ESW participants. Additional information will be available at evidenceworkshop.com.
